JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Summary	<p>The Summer Travel Trip Camp Counselor is responsible for assisting and participating in the following tasks: Supervision of participants, administering behavior protocol as directed, administering all medical protocol as directed, verbal & physical assistance, & completes all other tasks as directed. A primary function of this & every other job at the Kostopoulos Dream Foundation is to ensure that each member, guest & visitor receives the highest caliber of service.</p>

Responsibilities	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Act as an integral member of the residential summer camp program team. 2. Assist and participate in the following tasks: Supervision of participants, administering behavior protocol as directed, administering all medical protocol as directed, verbal & physical assistance, & completes all other tasks as directed. Ensuring safety of campers while on travel trip. 3. Assist Travel Trip Group Leader in implementing assigned programs. 4. Complete and submit all required paperwork by set deadlines. 5. Assist Travel Trip Group Leader in assessing program equipment and supply needs. Helping prepare items for departure on Monday and cleaning supplies on Friday. 6. Assist in the care, cleanliness, and security of the facility used by campers during the program. 7. Monitors safety of all aspects of the program and campers. 8. Communicates all pertinent issues affecting the programs to Travel Trip Group Leader (i.e. staff/client/parent/ transportation issues & concerns, etc), in a timely manner. 9. Establish good rapport with families of the program participants as well as keeps them informed about concerns affecting the camper. 10. Participate in all required trainings and certifications in compliance with the organization's standards. 11. Communicate clearly, honestly and respectfully with staff, participants, parents and volunteers. 12. Create a nurturing, positive and professional environment while promoting program policies and procedures amongst staff, volunteers and community. 13. Rotating overnight duty in camper tent/cabin.
Qualifications	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Must be at least 21 years of age and have a clean criminal background check. 2. Able to live on-site Sunday night through Friday afternoon (except while on trip). 3. Knowledgeable of Cognitive & Physical Disabilities, including autism spectrum disorders, Down syndrome, developmental delays, spina bifida, etc. (preferred) 4. Previous experience working with individuals with cognitive and physical disabilities preferred. 5. Excellent interpersonal communication skills. 6. Demonstrated history of responsibility, dependability, and maturity. 7. Current First Aid/CPR certification. 8. Ability to be flexible, creative and adaptable to situations. 9. Ability to consistently lift, carry and load adaptive and other sports equipment that may weigh 50 or more pounds, and sustain aerobic activity for 20 consecutive minutes. 10. Must be able to commit to contracted dates from May-August. 11. Commitment to a positive, fun and team-oriented working environment 12. Outdoor cooking and skills preferred.
